A Note from the Artistic Director:

Welcome to the Kingdom of Sweets! Today we journey from the holiday bash of the century, to a battle scene dream between toys and mice, travel though powdered sugar snow, to a kingdom filled with delights from across the globe!

What a great semester this has been, and such a joy to be back in the Pavilion for another winter show.



Dance was my first true love. My second was a peachy-pink rhinestone and sequined professional tutu sewed by my mother when I was 17. My third was when I got to perform the role of "The Sugar Plum Fairy" wearing the tutu.

The first Weehawken Dance Production was the Nutcracker in 2007, with 50 dancers set in 4 weeks of class. The Weehawken Dance program (originally called Ouray County Dance), was mostly word of mouth. Parents would speak with other parents and we would get another new student the next week of class. We had no advertising and ballet barres were a thing of the future for this fledgling program. The elevated stage at the Wright Opera House would serve as our "barre". By our second year, Nutcracker had grown to over 100 dancers. Word was spreading fast, and classes were being populated with students from Montrose, Ridgway, Ouray & Telluride. A second "studio" space was opened at the Old School House in Ridgway. With this expansion, and the generosity of our community, ballet barres were acquired. We didn't have much in the early days, but we had plenty of LOVE.

If this is your first Nutcracker, or your fifth, one thing sure to leave an impression will certainly be the costumes. They beautifully highlight the hard work, dedication, and passion our young dancers pour into this production. Weehawken Dance program costumes are the direct result of hundreds of hours of work generously given by many under the watchful eye of Lead Costumer, Betsy Pyeatte. This year brought the unexpected passing of my Mother. A huge hole was ripped into the heart of Weehawken Dance. Nutcracker was HER production to showcase passion, talent, and LOVE. Early 1900's party scene dresses and tutus galore, Nutcracker was Betsy's domain. Her costumes live on, and will be danced-in across the Pavilion stage this weekend.

Love is what stitches and glues Weehawken Dance together.

Watching our dancers on-stage, **we hope you see the love our program has cultivated.** When we love, we counteract hate. It motivates us to be better versions of ourselves. We find something to dedicate ourselves to and inspire us.

While I do not ever teach a student hoping they might grow up to be a professional dancer, I do work to inspire each student to love the arts and feel like they are better versions of themselves because of their time at Weehawken Dance.

Thank you for your support. Thank you for trusting us with your most valuable possession - your children. And thank you for loving this program too.

FIFTEEN? *I can barely believe that this is Weehawken Dance's fifteenth major December show!* It has been such an incredible ride with Miss Natasha Pyeatte and I couldn't



be more proud of how this program has evolved and how our communities have collectively embraced what Weehawken has been offering up since 2004.

I can vividly recall our early visioning sessions where we dared to think big. We dreamed of a regional dance program that wasn't limited to a single building; A program with high educational standards and production quality to match; but more, a program where fostering a love of dance was number one. We adopted a philosophy of accessibility and built the program around unconventional ideas such as owning and maintaining the costumes so that the costs would be kept low for our participants. We developed our scholarship programs. We thought about how this program could build our communities and give participants a bigger view of exactly what community is.

Over the course of this weekend, over 275 dancers and over 500 costumes will cross this stage, from ages 2.5-adult. This production reflects countless hours of love and dedication from teachers, staff and volunteers over the course of many years. It is the finished work of an incredibly talented team of teachers and the passion they have for the amazing students they get to teach each week.

And then there's Weehawken Creative Arts.....for nearly nineteen years, Weehawken has been transforming the lives of children and adults in the region through our dance program, art education offerings and beloved community cultural events. Offering literally hundreds of programs each year, I've seen first-hand how an organization can impact lives, build economies and develop character, confidence and poise. The Nutcracker-Show Synopsis

Drosselmeyer (in this show, Godfather Guthrie!), magician and maker of mechanical dolls, invented a better mousetrap. It killed off half the mice in the royal palace!

Seeking revenge, the Rat King transformed Drosselmeyer's nephew, Hans-Peter, into an ugly Nutcracker doll. Only by killing the Rat King, and being loved by a young girl, can Hans-Peter be released from the spell.

The Stahlbaum family invites Drosselmeyer to their annual Christmas party. He brings *magic* with him as he presents the Nutcracker as a gift to their daughter Clara, who quickly falls in love with her new doll. When the party's over, Clara sneaks downstairs to find her beloved Nutcracker.

Drosselmeyer sends an angel to transform the house into a battlefield and Toy soldiers fight the Rat King and his Mice. At last, with the help of Clara, the Nutcracker disposes of the Rat King and once again the Nutcracker becomes Hans-Peter (Nutcracker Prince)!

Clara and the Nutcracker Prince go on a beautiful journey through the Land of Snow, an enchanted forest wonderland where they are welcomed by dancing snowflakes. Next, the Prince escorts her to the Kingdom of the Sweets where they are greeted by the Sugar Plum Fairy. The Prince tells her about their daring battle with the army of mice and she rewards them with a celebration of dances with a grand finale of the Pas De Deux featuring the Sugar Plum Fairy and the Cavalier.

Clara awakens from her dream and finds herself by her Christmas tree with her beloved Nutcracker.






